

# IMTU TO CONDUCT A WEEK-LONG FREE, COMPREHENSIVE VISION CLINIC

**MAY 8<sup>th</sup> to 12<sup>th</sup>, 2017**

The International Medical and Technological University (IMTU) will conduct a free vision clinic to assist the needy in and around Dar es Salaam. This clinic is scheduled from May 8<sup>th</sup> to 12<sup>th</sup>, 2017 at the university premises in Mbezi Beach area on New Bagamoyo Road. It is done in partnership with the OneSight Foundation a not for profit charitable organization from the USA. More than 3000 people that are pre-registered will get comprehensive eye exam conducted by a board certified Optometrist and if needed high quality eye glasses will be custom made based on prescription right at the clinic sight.
